## PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE

Since qualification, Andy has worked for several NHS trusts – mostly in a locum capacity – providing him with a large breadth of experience across the North of England. The fast-paced environment in which locum staff operate, has meant that integrating within existing team structures is seamless and that functioning as part of a new team consistently reaches a high standard.

The vast majority of public sector work was performed in a community setting. This would routinely involve assessing patients in their own homes and developing rehab programmes to maximise each patient's potential and/or preventing hospital admission. Working as part of the wider multidisciplinary team, ensuring all needs and risks were identified on initial assessment – even those outside of the scope of physio practice - meant that patients could be signposted to the appropriate services, without the need for repeated and time-consuming assessments.

Andy also opened and operated his own private physio practice in Manchester until March 2022. This enabled him to implement bespoke, evidence-based rehab plans for complex musculo-skeletal sports injuries.
